Types of Applications

<u>Universal</u>

The universal subsidy is set at a rate of €0.50* per hour and is available for up to 45 hours per week. It is available to children aged between 24 weeks and 15 years(since sept 2022). The universal subsidy is based on the child's age, and not on income. Parents do not have to undergo an assessment of income to avail of this subsidy.

Income Assessed

Income Assessed subsidies are available to families with children aged between 24 weeks and 15 years. This subsidy provides a higher rate of subsidy than the universal subsidy for an applicant with reckonable income below €60,000. They are means tested and will be calculated based on your individual circumstances. The level of subsidy depends on (i) the child's age and education status and (ii) "reckonable income". It can be used towards the cost of a Tusla registered childcare place for up to a maximum of 45 hours per week.

<u>Sponsor</u>

Section 14 of the Childcare Support Act 2018 allows special arrangements where a child can be referred by certain Statutory Organisations for an NCS subsidy where childcare is needed on child welfare, child protection, family support or other specified grounds. There are strict criteria applicable for a referral to be made. There is no copayment fee (Service provider cannot charge anything for a sponsor place)



Key Points

- You must have 2 calendars for NCS; current programme call and future programme call
- Service Providers who provide transport to/from school should include the time the child is in the bus in attendance (claimed hours)
- It is very important for a parent to confirm the claim, otherwise payments will be affected

Attendance and Closure Rules



Under Attendance Rules

- First 8 weeks under attendance: The Service Provider marks under attendance in returns by selecting "Report Variance"
- Parent receives notification, in the following 4 weeks:
- (1) If child continues to under attend; this leads to the recoupment process.
- (2) If child returns to full attendance; this resets the under attendance.
- (3) The Service Provider can adjust the claim.
- 12 weeks of under attendance: Service Provider is asked to submit exact hours child has attended. Recoupment process will commence
- This means less payments for Service Provider



Absent Rules

 If child has been absent for <u>4 consecutive weeks</u> – Service Provider submits a return on the Hive (Report Variance). Notice is sent to parent and the Service Provider

 The Service Provider has 2 weeks to find out if child is coming back or to end claim

Pobal will recoup 2 weeks payment at the 6th week of absence



Paid/non-paid closures

- Paid: 10 subsidized closures are allowed during the year. Bank holidays are automatically counted as subsidized closures
- Non-Paid: Once the Service Provider goes over 10 subsidized closure days any future closures will be non-paid
- NB: 4 weeks' notice must be given to Pobal and to parents if adding a closure



Error Messages



Error Message 1

- "Award week not found" refers to if the parent has applied for new a CHICK and has expired the old CHICK
- Service Provider must: 1)End old claim. 2)Retrieve new CHICK. 3)Create new Claim




Error Message 2

- Sponsor CHICKS and the error <u>"You do not have permission to view this CHICK"</u>
- Service Provider must contact Pobal
- The Issue is the CHICK was assigned to the wrong/different service



Claim is in Draft stage




Where to access Programme Funding






Programme Funding View

Programme funding view shows general information around Payments. It is a list/summary of overall payments.






Payment Schedule View



- Run Date: Date that the payment is processed by Pobal
- Pay Until: Date that particular payment is covering. The pay until date will be the previous Sunday.
 NCS is always paid 1 week in arrears
- Total Due Including This Period: Amount the Service Provider has received up to this date




Where to access Payments Issued

- Payment Instruction: reference number for that specific payment






Where to access Allocations





Allocations View



Allocation's view is a breakdown of how the payments are actually calculated.

- Payment Instruction: reference number for that specific payment
- Allocation Description: number of hours by hourly rate
- Allocation source: Claim hours (standard payment)


CHICK Subsidy Calculator
